Have you been to the cinema recently? We went a few weeks ago having at last found a film that we both wanted to see! It wasn't scfi or fantasy or something violent which some films seem to be. In fact our children nowadays tend to vet films "You won't like it mum". They know my taste.

Well we went to see "Conclave" which sounds rather turgid, as it deals with the choosing of a new Pope after the current one had died. Cardinals gather from all over the world and the discernment process begins. Eventually after several days of stalemate voting and a few intriguing sub plots, the white smoke rises from the special chimney.

The film was actually adapted from a book of the same name by Robert Harris. What was interesting was that the film followed very closely the story of the book. So often the subsequent film seems to bear little resemblance to the book, which can be very disappointing.
